#### Proviso Wellness Zones Recap & Context

- Fall of 2023 YVPE advocated for Wellness Zone funding (Rep. Senn, Sen. Torres, Rep. Corry) with UW CoLab and WA Cradle to Career Network members, The Zone and Renton Innovation Zone.
- Early 2024 Suzy testified and rallied support for YVPE and the Proviso
- One million dollars awarded to establish 4 wellness zones and work with OHY, Commerce, and UW CoLab. Phase I partners; Granger and Mabton School Districts, Communities in Schools, Yakima Valley College and the backbone staff.
- We selected April Shine to serve as the fiscal agent and UW CoLab will be evaluating our collective efforts. First report draft is being finalized soon.
- Hosting a webinar on 11/13 with Sen. Torres and others to highlight the support and vision/purpose of wellness zones.
- We will pursue an additional request to carry phase II of our work based on need and learning from this baseline year.
